

Public Notice of Network Change under FCC Rule 51.325(a)

Destruction of Facilities Resulting from Wildfires in Malibu, California

January 8, 2008

In accordance with Section 51.325(a) of the Commission's rules, Verizon hereby provides public notice regarding the destruction of certain copper facilities caused by the Corral Canyon wildfire (the "Wildfire") in Malibu, California on November 23, 2007. The Wildfire destroyed 172 copper lines that originated from Verizon's Malibu central office (MALBCAXG) and routed through Verizon's cross-connect box (MALBCABQ). Access to these lines is no longer available. As a result of this event, Verizon immediately activated its Region Preparedness Plan (disaster recovery plan) for California and opened its Regional Control Center on November 24, 2007 to manage restoration efforts related to the Wildfire.¹

¹ In the event of disasters that prompt the triggering of a disaster recovery plan, the Commission granted Verizon a limited waiver of the advanced notification and waiting period requirements associated with its network disclosure rules (47 C.F.R. §§ 51.325-335), permitting affected carriers to concentrate on restoration efforts and execution of disaster recovery plans.
